The Moon landings: ‘One giant leap for Humanity’.

We are about to celebrate 50 years since this great event, but what does that mean, exactly? Are we saluting the American flag (as the astronauts did); or the prodigious feat of human technology which made it possible? Or is it perhaps the adventurous courage of the human spirit which projects humankind in to ever-new new phases of its ancient journey?

Neil Armstrong meant to balance that *resounding clarion call*, with a *murmur of modesty*: ‘One small step for man’ he actually meant to say, **‘for a man’ but it’s not so easy remembering your lines when you’re coming down a ladder backwards onto on another world!**

What do fallible humans really discover when they push out from the beautify the vast and awesome mystery of the cosmos? Could it be that, as Psalm 19 has it, ‘The Heavens are telling the glory of God’? Witness statements from crew members of Apollo 11, and from modern researchers, suggest that answer still holds good. Just how convincing is it today? And what, if we can still make it, does that answer mean for our future?
